Circle Middle School

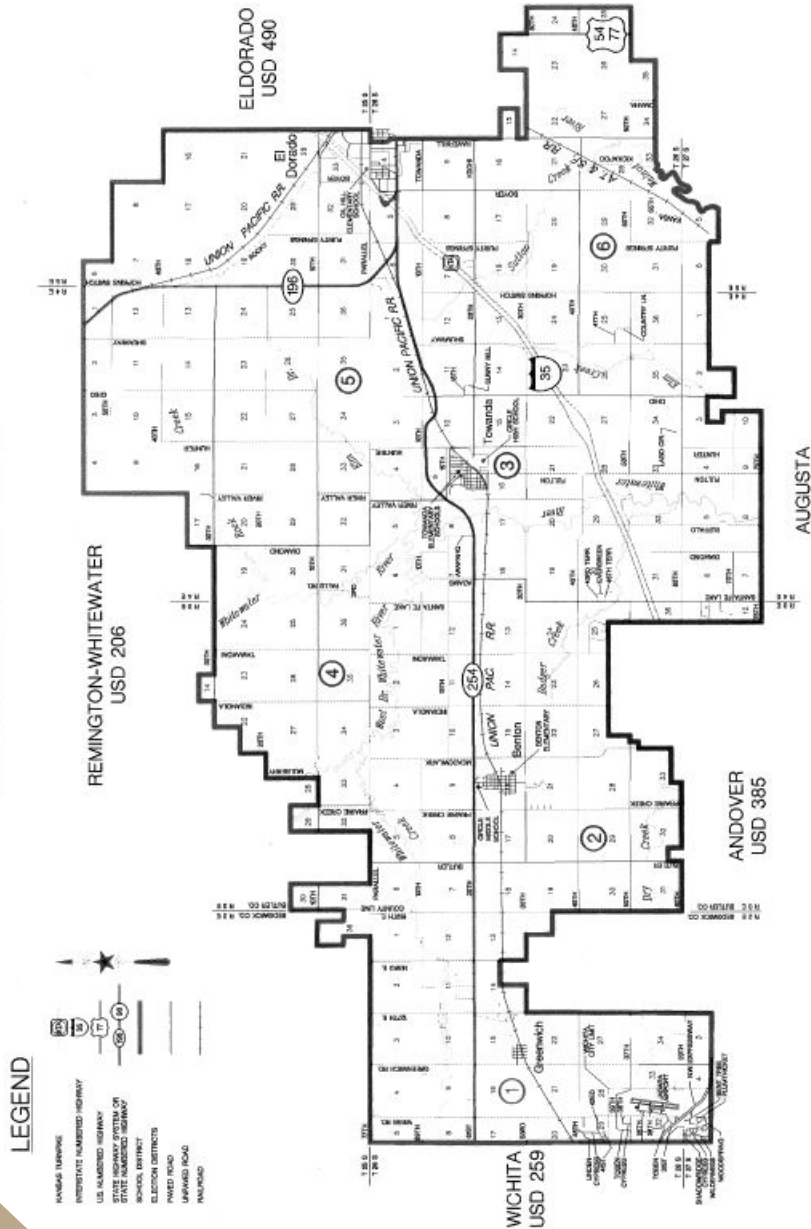
- Serves seventh and eighth grade students.

Welcome to Circle USD 375

The towns of Benton, Towanda, Greenwich, Township Village in El Dorado, Bel Aire and Northeastern Wichita make up the Circle District. Circle USD 375 encompasses approximately 175 square miles of western Butler and northeastern Sedgwick Counties.

Bus routes are established by the Transportation Department and families will be contacted with bus route information - location of stops and pickup times - prior to the beginning of the school year.

Bus routes are mapped out with primary regard to safety, efficiency and economy.

Meeting Individual Needs

Special Education Programs are available to qualified students through the Butler County Special Education Interlocal. Staff members are readily available for students with special needs including: early childhood, learning disabilities, behavior disorders, gifted education, speech, language, occupational and physical therapy.

Title I Teachers and aides work at each qualifying school providing extra help for students in reading and math. These professionals work with first, second and third graders. Summer school programs in remedial reading and math are also held each summer for elementary students.

Circle District works with **Project Encore** located in East Wichita to offer online learning, tutoring and remedial course work for high school students. Through Encore, high school students can also attend summer school to make up credits in required classes. All students using these services must be referred by the high school administration.

Counselors are available in all schools in the district. Counselors work with individuals, small groups and in classroom settings providing a full support program and career education program. Students K-12 can also receive individualized lessons in math and reading using various software programs.
